REASONS FOR BILL:

This bill authorizes the Department of Public Health (DPH) to provide data and documentation regarding parentage, such as birth certificates, to the Department of Children and Families (DCF). Currently, DPH holds that information and is limited in how and when they may release it to other agencies. Through this legislation, DPH can provide DCF with the proper documentation needed for child welfare purposes. Accessing services such as healthcare and Social Security require this type of documentation, and this legislation seeks to facilitate the process of acquiring those documents for children in the child welfare system.

RESPONSE FROM ADMINISTRATION/AGENCY:

[The Office of Chief Public Defender, Assistant Public Defender Chris Oakley](#): The Office of the Public Defender supports H.B. 5268, which would allow the Department of Public Health to release parentage information directly to DCF to expedite the establishment of parentage in child protection cases. The agency argues that eliminating delays in obtaining birth certificates or acknowledgments of parentage will promote timely permanency for children and ensure parents and relatives can fully participate in court proceedings regarding child welfare.
