## **REASONS FOR BILL:**

The manufacturing industry exists as one of Connecticut's most lucrative industries, generating more than \$34 billion annually and employing 10% of the states workforce this industry exists as the second largest contributor to the states GDP. This bill has been created in order to further support manufacturing business in the state of Connecticut by, requiring the Department of Economic and Community Development (DECD) to conduct a study into the needs of manufacturers in the state and report its findings.
