***AN ACT CONCERNING THE SUSPENSION OF AN OPERATOR'S LICENSE FOR REPEATEDLY FAILING TO STOP FOR A SCHOOL BUS.***

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. Subsection (b) of section 14-111 of the 2026 supplement to  
2 the general statutes is repealed and the following is substituted in lieu  
3 thereof (*Effective October 1, 2026*):

4 (b) (1) Except as provided in subdivision (2) or (3) of this subsection,  
5 whenever the holder of any motor vehicle operator's license has been  
6 convicted or has forfeited any bond taken or has received a suspended  
7 judgment or sentence for any of the following violations, the  
8 commissioner shall, without hearing, suspend such person's operator's  
9 license or privilege to operate a motor vehicle in this state as follows:  
10 For a first violation of subsection (a) or subdivision (1) of subsection (b)  
11 of section 14-224 or section 14-110, 14-215 or 53a-119b, for a period of  
12 not less than one year and, for a subsequent violation thereof, for a  
13 period of not less than two years; for a second violation of subsection (a)  
14 of section 14-279, for a period of six months and, for a subsequent

15 violation thereof, for a period of not less than one year; for a violation of  
16 section 14-222, for a period of not less than thirty days or more than  
17 ninety days and, for a subsequent violation thereof, for a period of not  
18 less than ninety days; for a violation of subdivision (2) or (3) of  
19 subsection (b) of section 14-224, for a period of not less than ninety days  
20 and for a subsequent violation thereof, for a period of not less than one  
21 year; for a first or second violation of subsection (c) of section 14-224, for  
22 a period of forty-five days and for a subsequent violation thereof, for a  
23 period of two years; for a first violation of subsection (b), (d) or (e) of  
24 section 14-147, for a period of not less than ninety days and, for a  
25 subsequent violation thereof, for a period of not less than five years; for  
26 a first violation of subsection (c) of section 14-147, for a period of not less  
27 than thirty days and, for a subsequent violation thereof, for a period of  
28 not less than one year.

29 (2) Notwithstanding the provisions of section 14-111b and except as  
30 provided in subdivision (3) of this subsection, whenever the holder of  
31 any motor vehicle operator's license or youth instruction permit who is  
32 less than eighteen years of age or whenever a person who does not hold  
33 an operator's license who is less than eighteen years of age has been  
34 convicted or has forfeited any bond taken or has received a suspended  
35 judgment or sentence for any of the following violations, the  
36 commissioner shall suspend such person's operator's license or  
37 privilege to obtain an operator's license as follows: For a first violation  
38 of subdivision (4) of subsection (a) of section 14-219 or subdivision (4)  
39 of subsection (b) of section 14-219, for a period of sixty days and, for a  
40 second violation thereof, for a period of ninety days and, for a third or  
41 subsequent violation thereof, for a period of six months; for a first  
42 violation of section 14-222, for a period of six months and, for a  
43 subsequent violation thereof, for a period of one year; for a violation of  
44 subsection (c) of section 14-224, for a period of six months and, for a  
45 subsequent violation thereof, for a period of one year; for a first violation  
46 of section 14-296aa, for a period of thirty days and, for a second violation  
47 thereof, for a period of ninety days and, for a third or subsequent

48 violation thereof, for a period of six months.

49 (3) The commissioner shall suspend the motor vehicle operator's  
50 license of any youth adjudged a youthful offender for a violation of  
51 section 14-215 or 14-222, subsection (b) of section 14-223 or subdivision  
52 (2) or (3) of subsection (b) or subsection (c) of section 14-224 for six  
53 months for a first offense and one year for a second or subsequent  
54 offense.

55 (4) Whenever any person who has not been issued a motor vehicle  
56 operator's license under section 14-36 is convicted of a second or  
57 subsequent violation of subsection (a) of section 14-36: (A) The  
58 commissioner shall suspend such person's privilege to operate a motor  
59 vehicle, (B) such suspension shall remain in effect for a period of ninety  
60 days, and (C) the commissioner shall not issue an operator's license to  
61 such person under section 14-36 until such period of suspension has  
62 expired and all applicable requirements for such license have been  
63 satisfied by such person.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:

**Statement of Purpose:**  
To suspend the operator's license of a person who has repeatedly violated state law requiring a motor vehicle to stop for a school bus that is displaying flashing red signal lights.
