The amendment changes the definition of identifying information to only include name and residential address. This does not change the underlying fiscal impact of the bill.

The amendment also allows instead of requires municipalities to require certain residential property owners and landlords to report information to the municipality. The underlying bill, unchanged by the amendment, establishes that failure to do so will result in a penalty of up to \$500 for a first violation and up to \$1,000 for subsequent violations. This eliminates any potential revenue gain to these municipalities to the extent they choose not to require this information.

The amendment eliminates sections 3 through 5 of the underlying bill which increase fines for violations of certain fire and building codes. This eliminates any potential revenue gain to the state associated with these sections.
