Meeting Summary

1. Update on JJPOC Bills:

- House Bill 5508 which includes recommendations for the reentry subgroup and the gender responsiveness workgroup has a public hearing this Wednesday.
- House Bill 5339 which includes the education workgroup recommendations went through the higher education committee and had a public hearing on March 5th, waiting to see where things go with the Bill.

2. Overview of Spotlight Presentations

- March: Panel discussion on community youth gun violence and presentation from DSS.
- April: Working with the Department of Housing and Connecticut coalition to end homelessness, presentation on youth homelessness, Community Expertise Workgroup Spotlight presentation.
- May: New case management system at the prosecutor's office, potential presentation on restorative justice.
- June: Unsure of presentations currently.
- July: Presentation from CYSA, JRB/YSB Workgroup Updates, Interested in increasing collaboration with law enforcement, may be helpful to speak with local police and JRB/YSB at this meeting.
- September: DOC
- October: Possible dual-involved youth conversation



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- November: Annual Report
- CT Judicial Would be happy to start a conversation about scheduling with OVA/JBCSSD Restorative Justice meeting in May
- Brittany LaMarr will reach out to the judicial to see if any preliminary conversations have been had.
- DCF was Wondering if they are on the agenda for this year, Brittany has them scheduled for October.

3. OPM Update:

- In preparation for the larger JJPOC meeting, OPM and Rep Walker usually have a meeting with TYJI to go over the agenda. At that meeting, it was shared that around the JJPOC community members are having questions involving dual-involved youth or cross-over youth. This began around a presentation that was given last year. With Daniel, co-chair of JJPOC moving forward, being newer to the conversation he has requested that TYJI work with the workgroups and JJPOC members to produce a higher-level one-page document that gives him a better understanding of the data that is being requested by members of the JJPOC from DCF and Judicial regarding this youth.
- This will help look at what could be produced and how a data request may work for this type of data.
- Since this conversation last week, OPM has learned that DCF and Judicial have already been working on a crossover youth pilot project that touches on a lot of the data requests that members would be making.
- The project is being worked on by CSSD, DCF, OPM, and Georgetown. University
- The goal is to provide summary statistics for crossover youth and test new technologies for data matching.
- OPM is not sure if this eliminates the need for the one-page document, but OPM wanted to let everyone know this information and that OPM is looking into it.
- Seems like the agencies have been working on this for quite some time.
- The reason for looking into this was to test privacy-enhancing technologies at a state level
 - i. Important, interesting set of techniques that have been used at federal levels
 - ii. There have been several pilots
 - iii. 3 or 4 different techniques centered around trying to minimize the need to share sensitive information across agencies.



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iv. Crossover youth would be a good pilot



because it is a population with higher

sensitivity, and it is a small population which makes it easier to work with.

- Fits a lot of different converging needs.
- 4. Equity Dashboard Update from OPM:
 - The team continues to work on the third measure for the dashboard and methods to update the dashboard with the latest data.
 - OPM has a meeting with CCLP about a document they hope will make the dashboard more accessible to a wider audience and increase awareness of the dashboard's capabilities.
 - OPM is working to continue to enhance the dashboard and keep it up-to-date
 - OPM currently has up-to-date data for the prior two measures of the dashboard.
