# **Meeting Summary**

### 1. <u>Workgroup updates:</u>

- Concerns regarding Children's Behavior Health System
- CT is going for a waiver of Medicaid that will allow for incarcerated individuals up to age 19 to have their Medicaid active 90 days before they are released
- Immerging Leaders Training exploring leadership qualities and refining those qualities.
- Help youth build relationships while they're in detention or step-down programs so when they are being re-entered, they have a place to go to.

# 2. <u>Reforming the youth legal system</u>

- Short-term action steps:
  - CEW led relationship building session and training for the JJPOC members. This provides a chance for youth and community members to build relationships with the JJPOC members.
  - Connecting CEW members with representatives from the tribes (medium goals?).
  - Push to fill the two youth voting seats on the JJPOC made available last year.
- 3. <u>Suggestions for future meetings:</u>
  - Avoid putting people on the spot
  - More welcoming, provide information to prepare youth for meetings.
  - Partner youth with adults

- Meetings are too long.
- Have someone follow-up and debrief with people who are new to the conversations and prep them for the next meeting.
- Be youth-friendly, avoid talking with high-level of expertise.
- Workgroup meetings conflict with school.
- Allow time for youth to talk amongst themselves before they engage back as a group
- Focus resources on proactive measures rather than reactive measures.
