Meeting Summary

1. Introduction and Overview

- The goal of the workgroup is to focus on the array of services for specific populations at high risk for contact with the juvenile justice system.
- Emphasis on meeting individual needs of those entering the system.
- Collaboration with ROCA and the Trafficking in Persons Council (TIP) to address trauma and connect individuals with services.

2. Workgroup Goals:

- Define the target lens for the workgroup.
- Understand the target population (who, how many, and location).
- Identify key considerations and best practices.
- Explore potential improvements.
- Define gender-responsive approaches.
- Review prior work in Connecticut related to juvenile justice.
- Identify gaps in services, especially those affecting girls.
- 3. Concerns Regarding Girls:
 - Girls placed in spaces not designed for them.
 - Discussion on data collection, screening processes, and identifying suitable placements for girls.
 - Consideration of a collaborative casework model for girls.
 - Highlighted the challenge of having trained gender-responsive officers without appropriate facilities for placements.

4. <u>Collaboration with Community Expertise Work Group:</u>

- Emphasis on involving youth and community members.
- ROCA's research informed by focus groups with young women.

5. <u>5. Draft of Workgroup Activities</u>

- Define "gender-responsive" in the context of the workgroup.
- Create a landscape of gender-responsive work in the state.
- Review previous gender-responsive initiatives.

- Engage stakeholders from various disciplines.
- Seek input from youth, families, and impacted communities.
- Collaborate with TIP for analysis and reports on municipal police data related to human trafficking.
- Develop an operational plan for reporting, collecting, and distributing police data on human trafficking.
- 6. Legislative Planning:
 - Discussion on the best plan of action for legislation in the 2024 Legislative cycle.
 - Compile legislative and policy recommendations for JJPOC/TIP.
