#### **Meeting Summary**

## 1. <u>Review Operational Workgroup Plan</u>

- Prioritize issue areas of focus
- Feedback was given from the members of the workgroup regarding the availability and measures for behavioral health, education, and other services for youth.
  - One of the members of the workgroup posed a question regarding how we are measuring the progress on the needs and treatment planning for incarcerated youth.
  - It was suggested that this group develop a rubric for evaluating this inbetween the release of larger reports to measure progress in those areas.
  - It was clarified that the Data Sharing Workgroup has received feedback from the JJPOC and other workgroups on what data measures are needed and will be doing data spotlights throughout 2023 to have the data on these issues.
- Update on the Re-entry Subgroup
  - If anyone is interested in becoming a co-chair for the re-entry subgroup you can reach out to Brittany LaMarr or Martha Stone
    - 1. Youth from MYI attended the previous re-entry meeting and were able to provide suggestions and insight into what they feel is important for their success upon release.
  - The re-entry subgroup has compiled a list of recommendations to bring forward to the workgroup.
- Update on Commissary Subgroup
  - If anyone is interested in becoming a co-chair for the commissary subgroup you can reach out to Brittany LaMarr or Mark Bonaventura.
  - The subgroup has been working with the DOC and receiving updates on the behavior motivation system that is being developed.
  - The DOC is working closely with CCSD and attempting to mirror some of the successful practices that they have in place for this system.

- Concerns were expressed regarding providing free commissary to youth could potentially be challenged in court by other incarcerated populations. Similar to 2018 when divorce services were provided to the female population the male population challenged the policy and it had to be discontinued.
- It was clarified that those concerns will be kept in mind and this concern will be a part of the conversation throughout the process of developing and implementing this system.
- 2. <u>Present the Workgroup Timeline for Recommendations.</u>
  - At the next meeting of this workgroup everyone should receive a draft of the language of the recommendation proposals.
  - The final package of recommendations must be completed by early December and the chairs of each workgroup will present these recommendations at the December JJPOC meeting to be voted on.
