Meeting Summary:

- 1. Briefly mention the transitional living program model
- 2. <u>Re-Entry welcome center</u>
 - CPA operates in Hartford and Waterbury
 - There are centers open in Bridgeport and New Haven as well.
 - Satellite office in New London at the Opportunities Industrialization Center
 - Adults over the age of eighteen are eligible.
 - CPA/Centers partners significantly with the Department of Corrections.
 - Each site has computer labs.
 - Strive Program: Pre-Employment workshops.
- 3. Opportunities to enter into a host of trainings.
 - Manufacturing, culinary, etc.
- 4. Kinetic Re-Entry Collaborative
 - Working on legislative issues, advocacy, and encouraging people to share their stories and issues they've experienced.
 - Lack of ID, lack of housing, etc.
- 5. The Evaluation Report was touched upon.
- 6. <u>A lot of other programs have decided to focus on the brain development age group</u> (eighteen to twenty-five years old).
- 7. <u>The age group for the evaluation report talked about is low for the eighteen to</u> <u>twenty-five age group. This could be because of the following possibilities:</u>
 - The adults may have other programs.
 - They may not have the support they want or need.
 - They may not want to go to any programs.



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- They may not be ready to embrace what the programs have to offer to them.
- 8. Anybody with an inmate number can be served.
- 9. <u>Beth Hines talked about how the CPA knows when an individual goes to them, how</u> they know what the individual's mental health needs are:
 - The CPA doesn't always know.
 - If there is a relationship with a re-entry counselor, they provide the CPA with the information needed.
 - A lot of the needs are self-reported.
 - Score assessment is done on the participants.
 - This identifies addiction and substance abuse needs.

10. <u>Welcome center age group were mentioned again.</u>

- Should the age group be changed to fourteen to seventeen or even fifteen to twenty-one?
- Should we repeat a welcome center model, as well as a council model?
 - What components are needed to do this?
- Is a youth model needed?
