- Participate in the August Work Group meeting to (1) assist with development of mission and vision statement for Work Group, including helping to develop strategic priorities, and (2) provide an overview of diversion resources that CCLP shared and explain how they can be helpful to the Work Group.
 - Tasks: Facilitate mission and vision exercise with RED Work Group; present examples of work in other jurisdictions and lead discussion of opportunities in Connecticut.
- <u>Develop a proposed Work Plan specific to leveraging opportunities to analyze diversion</u> <u>through the lens of racial and ethnic disparities.</u>
 - Tasks: Work with RED Work Group co-chairs to develop a proposed Work Plan in between RED Work Group committee meetings based on identified opportunities in Connecticut and CCLP's experience with other jurisdictions.
- <u>Develop proposed data collection template and protocol for monitoring and oversight of</u> <u>early diversion efforts for future use by RED Work Group and provide strategic advice to</u> <u>maximize research planned for select jurisdictions on current early diversion practices.</u>
 - Tasks: Develop proposed data collection template and protocol that will help RED Work Group monitor and assess early diversion efforts through the lens of racial and ethnic disparities; speak with partners about current data availability and challenges to identify (1) data collection and reporting that can currently occur using available data, and (2) data collection and reporting based on best practices that the Work Group should advocate for moving forward; provide strategic advice to University of New Haven researchers who are planning to analyze diversion trends in select jurisdictions.
