## **Meeting Summary:**

- Proposed Next Steps for the workgroup:
  - It was suggested that the workgroup revisit the Public Health, Ecological, and Restorative Justice Model presented by Dr. Derrick Gordon and Keisha April.
    - Each model takes a different look at the individual; when speaking on youth, people tend to be more selective.
    - The focus should be measured but as a continuative system; when talking about the focus, it should also not be in response to negativity.
    - Model presents own challenges on how to monitor the models progress and steps on a universal and selective level.
    - There was a discussion on implementation to a larger population, education to youth, and resources.
- Next Steps
  - How do we measure and track the outcome of the model? Systems have to share data, however, do not communicate. We need a framework to explain the value of the system. There was a discussion on requesting RED data from OPM.
  - The group could include their feedback about the PowerPoint to make it more applicable and digestible.
  - It was suggested that this model be introduced to JJPOC and lead into a proposal and a recommendation.
  - The Workgroup will formulate two subgroups: one focused on policing and one focused on data.
