 - Discussed main focus areas around youth justice, in particular violence intervention and prevention workgroup in Hartford
 - Discussed the established MOU and program goals framed around reduce high risk and recidivism

 - In the flowchart discussed juvenile probation plan and their important needs, along with the duties of JCSC (Juvenile Coordinated Services Committee)

 - Wait list for Bridgeport, Waterbury, New Haven; kids not getting the services they need in a timely manner



- Need to look at DCF Committed, Juvenile Justice, Protective Supervision, and Investigations
- African American Boys continue to be the highest category regarding juvenile justice referrals and incarceration
- School-based arrests, highest in Waterbury and in New Haven regarding auto fax
 - future meeting with mayor to discuss progress
- High chronic absenteeism throughout the cities
 - Highest in high school students
 - Question asked about strategies, interventions, outreach to communities with highest absenteeism
 - What are we doing to get our kids back into their school settings?
 - Each community and school have their own ideas of interventions ways they do referrals and trying to bring all the services together to address the absenteeism
 - CSDE spoke about their research and work that will be reported sometime in April
 - Discussed funding for education cost sharing and talking about accountability
