UCH has a Position Review Committee which meets biweekly. The committee is responsible to review all vacant positions being requested by departments. The committee approves the positions based on certain criteria (i.e. Revenue generating, mission critical, patient care level of staffing needs, curriculum/accreditation requirements and cost reduction).

Over 75% of the positions are revenue producing or mission critical (50% of the positions are clinical and 25% are Research/Academic). 19% of the positions are for facilities management such as custodial services. The remaining positions are administrative.
