Steps to Identify Alliance Districts

Alliance Districts are school districts with among the lowest Accountability Index scores in the state. The following steps were used to identify 36 Alliance Districts for the fiscal years ending June 30, 2023 to June 30, 2027, inclusive:

Step 1: Include local and regional school districts only. This excludes the following district types:

- CT Technical High School
 - Endowed Academies
- Public Charter Schools
- Regional Educational Service Centers
- Unified School Districts

Step 2: Include districts with at least 1000 students in 2019-20. The Oct 2019 enrollment is used since it is the last enrollment count prior to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Step 3: Compute the weighted average of the Accountability Index scores_from 2017-18 and 2018-19 combined, sort from low to high based on that Accountability Index, and select the 33 lowest. Then add any district that was previously an Alliance District for the five year period between July 1, 2017 and June 30, 2022.
