
Measuring recidivism for program clients in the AIC, ABHS, and FVEP Programs

Alternative in the Community

- Definition:
 - Recidivism is defined as the measurement of a program client obtaining a new arrest (excluding technical violations) within 12 months of discharge from program.
 - Program completers are defined as clients who successfully complete all requirements of their referral to the AIC program.
 - Incomplete without opportunity clients are defined as those who did not successfully complete the program due to factors outside their control (ex: serious health issue or a need for higher level of care).
 - Incomplete with opportunity clients are defined as those who did not successfully complete the program due to lack of attendance, violation of program rules, or re-arrest.

12-Mo Recidivism - The percentage of referrals who completed the program and were re-arrested within 12 months of discharge from the AIC over time.

Alternative in the Community Summary


- Over the past three years, on average:
 - Clients who successfully completed the AIC recidivated within 12 months at a rate of ~ 21.6%
 - Clients *without* opportunity to complete the AIC recidivated within 12 months at a rate of ~ 33.6%
 - Clients *with* opportunity to complete the AIC recidivated within 12 months at a rate of ~ 43.6%

Adult Behavioral Health Services (ABHS)

- Definition:
 - Recidivism is defined as the measurement of a program client obtaining a new arrest (excluding technical violations) within 12 months of discharge from program.
 - Program completers are defined as clients who successfully complete all requirements of their referral to the ABHS program.
 - Incomplete without opportunity clients are defined as those who did not successfully complete the program due to factors outside their control (ex: serious health issue or a need for higher level of care).

Adult Behavioral Health Services Summary

- Over the past three years, on average:
 - Clients who successfully completed ABHS recidivated within 12 months at a rate of ~ 21.3%
 - Clients *without* opportunity to complete ABHS recidivated within 12 months at a rate of ~ 32.2%
 - Clients *with* opportunity to complete ABHS recidivated within 12 months at a rate of ~ 40.1%

Family Violence Education Program (FVEP)

- Definition:
 - Recidivism is defined as the measurement of a program client obtaining a new domestic violence arrest within 12 months of discharge from program.
 - Program completers are defined as clients who successfully complete the FVEP intervention.
