- FAVOR is a Connecticut state affiliate organization of the National Federation of Families for Children's Mental Health

FAVOR Programs



FAMILY PEER SUPPORT SPECIALISTS (FPSS)

Provides direct services to families in need.

FAMILY SYSTEMS MANAGERS (FSM)

Create integrated networks of care that champions the family and youth voice.

CONNECTICUT MEDICAL HOME INITIATIVE (CT-MHI)

Assists families to obtain medical equipment, prescriptions, and respite for caregivers of children with special healthcare needs.

LEARNING AND

Provides virtual and inperson trainings and community conversations.



Family Peer Support Program

Peers:

- Provide <u>direct</u> peer support services to families with children who have:
 - Neurobiological, Mental, Emotional or Behavioral Health Challenges
 - Medically Complex
 - Special Education Needs
- Provide a safe space for parents to share
- Provide expertise in educational needs
- Understand parents needs



Profile of a Family Peer Support Specialist

Professionals with Lived Experience

- Our Family Support Specialists are also parents/caregivers of children/youth, young adults or siblings who have neurobiological, behavioral, mental and/or special health care needs.
- Family Peer Support Specialists receive ongoing training, while also:
 - Onboarding with other FAVOR program department Leads
 - Shadowing Seasoned Peer Support Specialists
 - Being part of the COPAA (Council of Parent Advocate & Attorneys) network; attending meetings or conferences
 - Receiving consultation from attorneys, advocates and other community partners
 - Nationally Certified Family Peer Support Specialists

Types of Referrals



SYSTEM OF CARE

These referrals come from Care Coordination. Family Peer Support Specialists and Care Coordinators work as a team to assist families for a period of approximately **6 months**.



BRIEF INTERVENTIONS

These are referrals received from a variety of sources, including the family themselves, hospitals, schools, and other community providers for a period of **3 months**.
