## TASK FORCE MEETING- October 16, 2013

TOPIC- "Ways to improve the puppy industry and ensure healthy animals in CT" SPEAKER- Peter Noel - Owner, Gentle Jungle Pet Store, Meriden, CT

My name is Pete Noel, I own Gentle Jungle Pet Store in Meriden, CT and I love animals! Myself, my wife and my staff of 12 fellow animal lovers, sell puppies, kittens, bunnies and virtually everything that is presently legal. We have five puppy play rooms, a kitten play area-all where the public can enjoy the animals for free. Over seventy puppy kennels all individually reverse ventilated to aide in the health of the puppies. Southbury Vet Hospital physically comes to the store every seven days (not every 15 days as state law dictates) and examines every puppy/kitten weekly. We have 100 hrs of animal care/clean up on a weekly basis to keep the animals clean and healthy. We are located in a large mall so hundreds of people come through our doors regularly and the people love us! Ray Connors was my animal control inspector for 10 years.

My Father opened his first pet store when I was nine years old, so I have been in the pet store business a long time. The topic is "Ways to improve the puppy industry and ensure healthy animals in CT." I have many suggestions, but in three minutes of testimony here are two:

1.) It is always pet store, breeder, internet or rescue organizations. All four are options for the customer, all have pros and cons. Pet stores provide only 8% of the puppies in CT. and are highly regulated, what about the other 92%????? If the government is to protect and serve the public, why not make the rules that apply to pet stores applicable to all????? Make the puppy lemon law which protects the public on the 8% of pet store puppies, apply to the remaining 92% which are not protected. Every day

in the pet store people ask about the warrantee, we say triple vet check and a year!

- (1) State law requires the breeders vet to provide a health certificate for each puppy coming in.
- (2) State law requires the store Veterinarian to independently double check each puppy's health prior to being offered for sale.
- (3) State law provides the customer go to the vet of their choice for an independent third check. Anything wrong the customer may keep or return the puppy and receive up to \$500,00 in vet compensation.

If the puppy passes all three vet checks, there is also one year if something shows up later with similar compensation. State law says six months we give ONE YEAR! The public and the pupples should be protected in 100% of all transactions, not just the 8% bought from pet stores! Does the Task Force only see pupples from pet stores susceptible to illness or are pupples from breeders, the internet or rescue also at risk?????

2.) Second suggestion is we must have a civil discussion to protect the public in acquiring a puppy from a pet store, breeder, rescue or internet. This is the first of many meetings in the legislative process. All sides love animals. This summer on June 22, the CT Coalition against Puppy Mills organized a "peaceful protest" outside my store in the street, they rallied their troops and two people showed up with signs to protest from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. by 2:30 p.m. my picture taken from my wife's Facebook Page was posted on their website. Here is a sample of their members comments posted below my photo:

-----" A person without a soul"

----- "He looks like a pedophile"

----"Comparison to Hitler"

-----"Hell has a reserved room for him"

-----"Wow, a picture of a real life Ahole"

-----"Asswipe"

These fringe groups are here right now, a member of your task force has actively participated on their website numerous times. Myself, my wife, my kids, my employees, the store Veterinarian all love animals!!!!!

Will the legislature continue to only regulate the 8%, or help protect the public by addressing the other 92% as well????? If you purchase from the 92% in the morning and the puppy is sick by the afternoon, it's too bad for the customer! God Bless the animals and I hope sane minds prevail!
