I have a generator, so I was able to scramble, get gas, get oil, and save the food in my fridge. What if I didn't have a generator???? With notice I could have bought ice and filled coolers, etc. With no notice, I'd have lost all my food. And what about the fact that I and my partner work from home, dependent on the internet?? With notice, we could have relocated or switched schedules. With no notice, we'd have lost salary and potentially earned bad reviews from our places of employment. Thankfully, the unannounced power outage occurred 30 minutes after we both had finished for the day.

## This is NOT ACCEPTABLE.

Bottom line: Eversource has a monopoly on energy in most of the State of Connecticut. Either it must be forced to allow other energy companies in to create competition, or it must be fired and the State must take control, much like Norwich (which has been a success, if I am not mistaken).

Finally ... if none of that is feasible, then the State MUST impose delivery rate maximums so people can afford electricity (a necessity of life). Thankfully I am in a position to pay Eversource's predatory rates (barely), but my heart goes out to those people who make too much for subsidies but not enough to cover Eversource's gouging.

I find this entire situation disgusting and rank with corporate welfare/greed and government ineptitude.
