

I live in Sharon. Thank you for your hearings and efforts to date regarding Eversource.

I believe the company's overall corporate behavior and positioning remain wholly inconsistent with its responsibilities as a regulated entity - in addition to what needs to be done regarding the company's incompetence with respect to Isaias earlier this month.

I concur with the spirit of much of what the governor and Senator Blumenthal have been raising and advocating for this week, including exploring different ownership, governance, incentive and compensation models for the state's relationship with the utility.

In any other sector of the economy the CEO of a company with such bad acting as that of Eversource would face a different governance and compensation outcome, not only for the handling of Isaias but, in particular, for the overall response and communication strategy, which I see as inconsistent with how the vast majority of US corporations would have responded and communicated. All the more so during this 2020 era, when many corporations are being good actors and supporting communities and stakeholders.

I have professional experience advising on restructuring activities and transactions relating to regulated entities. To the extent there is a role on any advisory committee or task force for such a voice or contribution, I would be interested in exploring this and trying to add ideas and value to your efforts.
