Connecticut Information Sharing System (CISS)

A comprehensive, state-wide information technology system mandated by state statute CGS § 54-142s, and used by Connecticut Criminal Justice and Law Enforcement Agencies (LEAs) to share criminal justice information in a secure environment, thereby enhancing the safety of the public and criminal justice community through informed decision-making.





CISS Empowers Users By Providing...


"Google Like" Search

 Allows users to search 14 Criminal Records Source Systems for people, locations, events and property within a single common portal.

Electronic Workflows Replacing Current Paper

 Through CISS electronic Information Exchanges, it replaces the majority of the manual delivery of documents and data that occurs today.

One-time \$8.9M Bonding for CISS State-Wide Deployment Includes:

CISS Search Deployment

- Training about 13,000 users to conduct CISS search.
- Accesses 14 Criminal Records Source Systems within a single common portal.
- Includes all 169 town's Police Departments, all State Police and 9 CJIS Agencies

Connectivity to CISS

• Enable Record Management System (RMS) vendors in Connecticut to send CISS more than 90% of arrest information from police departments and state police barracks.

> Electronic Workflows Deployment

- CISS electronic information exchanges (workflows) increase the speed, quality, and quantity of arrest information in the criminal justice system.
- Enables "near real time" access to information.





CISS Expected Benefits to End to End for Criminal Justice Community:

> Expected Efficiencies Throughout Criminal Justice System

- Law Enforcement will not have to drive arrest reports to courts daily state-wide; Will be more available to improve public safety
- Early arrest reports to DMV to stop Operating Under the Influence drivers earlier
- Reduced data entry and errors at multiple CJIS agencies
- Reduced processing time end to end for Criminal Justice community
- Reduced material costs for manually exchanging documents
- Reduced Time Spent Manually Seeking Information
- > Estimated at least \$15.5M annual savings from efficiencies
 - In 2010, Independent consultant, MTG Management Consultants hired by OPM, reported expected efficiencies in detail
- > Bond Funds helps project break even within 5 years of full implementation.





One-time \$8.9M Bonding for CISS State-Wide Deployment Includes:

> Improve Decision-Making Through Data Analytics

• CJIS data centralization enables creation of reports, key performance indicators, dashboards, and statistical data to improve policy decision-making and business intelligence.

Realize Benefits of Existing Investment

• State made an estimated \$60.62M investment in the CISS that cannot be deployed without this final capital outlay. Majority of CJIS team members are contractors and bulk of bond funds is for that skilled labor.







