Proposed Midterm Adjustments to SFY2025 Bond Authorizations

- \$100 million Additional in "Fix it First Bridge" program funding to support the bridge paint program – due to 2023 bridge paint failure
- \$1.5 million Additional in "Environmental Compliance" program funding to support TS4 (Transportation Separate Storm Sewer Systems)





Bridge Paint Program

- Widespread paint failure on steel bridges occurred in February 2023
- Rapid temperature changes affected lead-based paint
- CTDOT cleaned up paint chips, loose paint and applied protective coating to exposed steel
- 220 bridges identified for recoating program
- Excludes bridges that are being rehabilitated
- New coating is a metallizing process

Bridge Paint Program (continued)

- Mid-term Budget includes \$100 million for first phase
- Initial project includes 16 high priority bridges
- Bridges in Cromwell, East Hartford, Farmington, Hartford, New Britain, Plainville, West Hartford
- Estimated to take 8 years to address all 220 bridges





Transportation Separate Storm Sewer Systems (TS4)





- Mid-term adjustment of \$1.5 million to address the following:
 - TS4 follows a Consent Order, under U.S. EPA oversight, work must be completed by 2031
 - CTDOT has undertaken cleaning storm water catch basins, and are looking to expand the program with contractor resources
 - Approximately 120,000 catch basins requiring service
 - Estimated cost for SFY2025 is \$1.5 million

- \$71.65 million: New Haven Line Track Improvement and Mobility Enhancement (TIME) Part 1 and 3
- \$23.2 million: Saugatuck River Bridge Replacement
- \$15.4 million: New Haven Line Network Infrastructure Upgrade

Administration of Local Programs

- CTDOT administers multiple 100% state funded programs for locals:
- Community Connectivity Grant Program (CCGP)
- Local Transportation Capital Improvement Program (LOTCIP)
- State Local Bridge Program (SLBP)
- Transportation Rural Improvement Program (TRIP)
- And many more!

These programs supplement federally funded programs, and help avoid complicated federal eligibility and regulatory requirements
