Attrition Rate for State Employees

The following information came from Linda Yelmini, head of the Office of Labor Relations at the Office of Policy and Management (OPM). Apparently there is not an overall attrition rate calculated but the table below are numbers from the State Employees Retirement System (SERS) for FY 07-08 and PRI staff calculated a separation rate. However, as the table shows, there were more hires/rehires than those who left during that year. Ms. Yelmini said you have to be cautious about thinking you would never have any new hires because many of those are in direct care or service like corrections or state police. The numbers are from the SERS, and while this would not count those in alternative plans, it does cover most state employees.
