JAMES J. KENNELLY, Democrat, of Hartford, Connecticut; born June 11, 1931; attended Hartford public schools; graduated from Bulkeley High School, Holy Cross College, and the University of Connecticut School of Law, LL.B. He also served in the Army Counter-Intelligence Corps in Japan.

State Representative from the 1st Assembly District, 1967, 1969, 1971, 1973; Assistant Majority Leader, 1967; Deputy Majority Leader, 1969; Deputy Speaker, 1971; Deputy Minority Leader, 1973; Co-Chairman, Joint Committee on Legislative Management. Served as Assistant Floor Leader in the 1965 Constitutional Convention and delegate, State and National Democratic Conventions.

He is a partner in the law firm of Kennelly, Klebanoff and Ellis and practices law in Hartford. He has served as President of the University of Connecticut Law School Alumni Association; State Chairman, Young Lawyers Section, Connecticut State Bar Association; member and Chairman, Hartford Charter Revision Commission; Director of Hartford Neighborhood Centers, Hartford Human Relations Commission; Director, St. Francis Hospital Association; Incorporator, Hartford Hospital, Mt. Sinai Hospital, St. Francis Hospital, and the Institute of Living; and is on the Board of Trustees for Connecticut Public Television.

He received the Eagleton Institute Outstanding Legislator Award, 1967.
