Reported Sexual Violence Statistics and Data at MxCC

Middlesex Community college was chartered by the State of Connecticut in 1966 to serve the 18 towns in Middlesex County including Middletown, Meriden and the Shoreline. We serve between 1900-3000 full and part-time students who attend the College each semester enrolled in credit bearing classes. Approximately 1200 students take classes throughout various Continuing Education and Workforce Development programs each year. Since 1966 MxCC has graduated over 10,000 students with associate's degrees. Another 1000+ certificates have been awarded. All students and employees, whether studying in Middletown or at Platt High School in Meriden, whether taking on ground, online or hybrid classes, are covered by the college's sexual harassment and assault policies.

As a publicly-supported institution of higher education, MxCC provides an array of educational services designed to meet the training, occupational, intellectual and cultural needs of the people of its region. MxCC is an integral part of the communities it serves in Middletown, Meriden and along the Shore, and as out mission statement says, "Students are the center of Middlesex Community College." We keep our students at the center by providing affordable, accessible, quality education and support services and by doing all we can to help our students succeed. We have a commitment to maintaining and improving the integrity of our environment and a deep concern for incorporating civic engagement into our courses and activities.

We attempt to keep our students and employees safe and aware of sexual harassment and assault through awareness campaigns, presentations, video viewings, distribution of the sexual harassment brochure, class discussions, and the use of the web-based Not Anymore program.

Discussion of Statistical Data

The college is fortunate that incidents of sexual assault, stalking, and intimate partner violence on the MxCC campus have been relatively few. Because of our commuter population, such incidents, if any, tend to occur off-campus. Sometimes out students share this information with a staff or faculty member as a disclosure and no action is needed to be taken by the college. Brochures are available for staff and faculty members to give to those reporting or disclosing an incident and all members of the college community can get the support they need. Since September of 2014, all incidents reported or disclosed to a faculty or staff member have been tracked on a tracking form submitted to the Title IX Coordinator or Deputy Title IX Coordinator. Prior to this date, faculty/staff were not required to complete and submit a tracking to the Title IX Coordinator.

MxCC also has a Behavioral Intervention Team (BIT) comprised of numerous campus leaders and faculty. It is the goal of the Behavioral Intervention Team (BIT) to ensure, to the extent possible, that Middlesex Community College is a safe and secure place in which to teach and learn. The BIT is a group of faculty, staff, and managers who meet biweekly to manage and reduce threats to safety—whether from students or employees—

before they cause harm. Once identified, the BIT takes a planned approach to assessing the threat and taking appropriate action. The BIT also supports a number of related projects including the development of MxCC's <u>Civility Statement and video</u>, and sponsoring Fresh Check Day, the College's mental health awareness day event. Faculty and Staff can access a Person of Concern form on the BIT webpage to report any concerns they might have about a student or team member.
