Such data points shall include, but not be limited to, data regarding (A) <u>student</u> <u>awareness of institutional</u> <u>policies and</u> <u>procedures</u> related to <u>sexual</u> <u>assault, stalking and intimate</u> <u>partner</u> <u>violence</u> ,	[Sec.1507] (iii) questions regarding <u>whether students</u> <u>know about institutional</u> <u>policies and procedures</u> related to domestic violence, <u>dating violence, sexual</u> <u>assault, sexual harassment,</u> <u>and stalking</u> ;	Both asking about awareness of institutional policies and procedures.
(1) (B) <u>if a student reported</u> <u>sexual assault, stalking or</u> <u>violence</u> to an institution of higher education or law enforcement, <u>the response to</u> <u>and results of such report</u> , and	<ul> <li>(iv) questions designed to determine, if victims reported domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, sexual harassment, or stalking—</li> <li>(I) to whom the incident was reported and what response the victim may have received;</li> <li>(II) whether the victim was informed of, or referred to, national, State, local, Tribal, or on-campus resources; and</li> <li>(III) whether the entity to whom the victim reported the incident conducted an investigation and the duration and final resolution of such an investigation;</li> </ul>	Both asking whether or not it was reported. "The response to and results of such report" is further extended by the federal legislation to include to whom the incident was reported, whether or not they were referred to resources, and if an investigation occurred, the duration of the investigation, and the final resolution of the investigation. This makes it more prescriptive than the state legislation.

2 recommend one or more sexual misconduct climate assessments that collect the data points identified by the council	(a) In General.—The Secretary of Education, in consultation with the Attorney General, the Director of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the Secretary of Health and Human Services, and experts in domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, sexual harassment, and stalking, <u>shall develop</u> , <u>design</u> , and make available <u>through a secure and</u> <u>accessible online portal</u> , <u>a</u> <u>standardized online survey</u> <u>tool regarding postsecondary</u> <u>student experiences with</u> <u>domestic violence</u> , dating <u>violence</u> , sexual assault, <u>sexual harassment</u> , and <u>stalking</u> .	Federal assessment must be completed, limiting our ability to recommend other tools. However, we can recommend the federal tool and questions to measure perceptions of campus safety.
