

I am writing to you today to ask you not to support the pro-criminal police reform bill being voted on this week. My husband is one of the many, many good law enforcement officers in this state. You will lose him and countless others if this bill goes through. You will lose the most qualified and professional officers because it simply won't be worth the risk. Officers will be completely unable and unwilling to do their job in fear for their families, who could have everything taken from them by being sued for one justified interaction with a criminal, while trying to serve and protect the good citizens of CT. Connecticut has a very limited number of use-of-force incidents (.02% last year), where this bill shouldn't even be necessary. Who will want to be a police officer if this passes? Where will new recruits come from once you lose all the good men and women who currently serve?

> We in CT know better than anyone how much we need police officers after horrible incidents like the Sandy Hook tragedy or 9/11. We do not want our police to hesitate should they have to respond to another active shooter, another domestic violence incident, another home invasion, or even acts of terrorism.
