Re: Draft Conservation and Development Policies: The Plan for Connecticut, 2018-2023

Dear Senators and Representatives:

The Office of Policy and Management (OPM) hereby re-submits the Draft *Conservation and Development Policies: The Plan for Connecticut, 2018-2023* (Draft C&D Plan) to the Continuing Legislative Committee on State Planning and Development (Continuing Committee), for its "approval, revision or disapproval, in whole or in part."

This is the third consecutive year that OPM has submitted the Draft C&D Plan for the General Assembly's consideration of adoption. During the 2018 legislative session, <u>House Joint Resolution No. 172</u> was not acted on by the General Assembly. In 2019, <u>House Joint Resolution No. 74</u> was raised, but not transmitted to the General Assembly.

<u>Section 16a-30</u> of the Connecticut General Statutes (CGS) requires the Continuing Committee to hold a public hearing on the Draft C&D Plan "not later than forty-five days after the convening of the next regularly scheduled session... Not later than forty-five days after completion of such public hearing, the committee shall submit the plan with its recommendation for approval or disapproval to the General Assembly."

When making its recommendation to the General Assembly, the Continuing Committee may want to consider re-setting the time period covered by the Draft C&D Plan from 2018-2023 to 2020-2025, as well as sponsoring legislation that revises the five-year cycle in statute.

OPM is well-aware of previous comments submitted by the Connecticut Chapter of the American Planning Association (CCAPA) during the April 23, 2018 and March 14, 2019 public hearings, concerning how the C&D Plan is implemented by state agencies. For the 2020 session, OPM intends to propose legislation similar to that which was raised in Section 6 of <u>Senate Bill 1009</u> during the 2019 session. If passed, I am confident that the resulting advisory reports prepared by OPM for state agencies will address CCAPA's concerns, as well as allow OPM to better inform the General Assembly about the implementation of the C&D Plan, in accordance with CGS Section 16a-32(c).

Finally, please note that the Locational Guide Map component of the Draft C&D Plan, which recommends the delineation of priority funding areas in accordance with CGS Section <u>16a-35c(b)</u>, is available electronically via OPM's website, at <u>https://portal.ct.gov/cdplan</u>.
