C&D Plan History



Current Law -C&D Plan

CGS 16a-24 through 16a-33a



- 5-year plan with mandatory milestones in revision cycle
- Consider numerous issues delineated in series of amendments, generally revolving around sustainable conservation and development
- Continuing Committee holds public hearing prior to sending to General Assembly
- State agencies are required to be consistent with the Plan when undertaking or authorizing/ funding any projects using more than \$200,000 in state or federal funds for:
 - The acquisition of real property
 - The development or improvement of real property
 - The acquisition of public transportation equipment or facilities

Current Law - Priority Funding Areas CGS 16a-35c through 16a-35h

- Before PFAs:
 - Frequent applications for map amendments (39 applications between 1979 and 2010)
 - Continuing Committee monitored state spending by Locational Guide Map category
- Law limits "growth-related" projects to PFAs, with exceptions for projects supported by local POCD
- Composite map of conservation and development factors, but development factors outweigh conservation factors

CCDF Recommendations (PA 21-29)



- Transform the C&D Plan into a visionary and objective-setting plan based on current data and analysis
- Maintain the C&D Plan as an Executive Branch plan with its development overseen by the Continuing Legislative Committee and OPM, and ultimate adoption by the CT General Assembly
- Meaningfully engage stakeholders in development of the Plan
- Ensure implementation of the C&D Plan
- Opportunity to enhance role of planning regions/ COGs in implementing statewide objectives through vertical coordination

Proposed HB 6647

- Incorporate broad intention of CCDF recommendations
- Adjust process timeline:

Current Law (PA 22-71)

- By Sept. 1, 2023 OPM presents draft to Cont. Comm.
- After Dec. 1, 2023 OPM revises draft as necessary
- By March 1, 2024 OPM posts draft plan to website
- By Aug. 1, 2024 OPM conducts public hearings in cooperation with COGs
- By Dec. 1, 2024 OPM presents revised draft to Continuing Committee
- Not later than 45 days after convening of next regularly scheduled Session, Cont. Comm. holds public hearing

<u>HB 6647</u>

- By <u>Dec. 1, 2023</u> OPM presents draft to Cont. Comm.
- After <u>Feb. 1, 2024</u> OPM revises draft as necessary
- By <u>May 1, 2024</u> OPM posts draft plan to website
- By <u>Aug. 1, 2024</u> OPM <u>refers</u> draft to COGs and solicits public input
- By Dec. 1, 2024 OPM presents revised draft to Continuing Committee
- Not later than 45 days after convening of next regularly scheduled Session, Cont. Comm. holds public hearing

Work to Date

- Discussions with state agencies generally supportive of moving to a more data-driven and implementable C&D Plan
- State GIS Office poised to assist
- Plan to use technology to conduct a more transparent planning process and to better solicit input from COGs, municipalities and stakeholder groups
- Brainstorming framework and role of C&D Plan

Discussion – Revise and/or Use Growth Management Principles Differently



- 1. Redevelop and Revitalize Regional Centers and Areas with Existing or Currently Planned Physical Infrastructure
- 2. Expand Housing Opportunities and Design Choices to Accommodate a Variety of Household Types and Needs
- 3. Concentrate Development Around Transportation Nodes and Along Major Transportation Corridors to Support the Viability of Transportation Options
- 4. Conserve and Restore the Natural Environment, Cultural and Historical Resources, and Traditional Rural Lands
- 5. Protect and Ensure the Integrity of Environmental Assets Critical to Public Health and Safety Promote
- 6. Integrate Planning Across all Levels of Government to Address Issues on a Statewide, Regional and Local Basis

Discussion – Enhance State and Regional Planning Integration



- CCDF Working Group identified opportunity for COGs to play a role in implementing state policy objectives at a local level
- Currently, OPM reviews regional (COG) Plans of Conservation and Development (POCDs) for comment on consistency with state C&D Plan and Economic Strategic Plan
- COGs review local POCDs for comment on consistency with regional, state and other community plans from within the region – OPM does not review local POCDs

Discussion-Redefine/ Refine "Consistency"

- Enable a system for indexing and mapping of policy objectives more practical than PFAs
- Opportunity to establish measurable objectives for accountability, including review processes for bond funded projects
- Enhance monitoring by Continuing Committee, OPM and others

Discussion-Role for Continuing Committee in Implementation

- Recommendation for regular, informal feedback between agencies and Continuing Committee on implementation
- Annual or semi-annual meetings to receive updates from agencies on progress and/or challenges to implementation
- Provides opportunity for Continuing Committee to better understand and/or respond to potential conflicts and implementation hurdles to address in subsequent Plan
