Consolidated Plan Regulatory Framework 24 CFR Part 91

- Established by regulation in 1995 to create common planning requirements for CDBG, HOME, ESG, HOPWA
 - National Housing Trust Fund was added under Title I of the Housing and Economic Recovery Act of 2008
 - CDBG-Recovery Housing Program (CDBG-RHP) will be added to the next ConPlan, due July 1, 2024
- Allows for plan to be submitted in a "form prescribed by HUD"
- By design, planning, should inform funding decisions that get help where it is needed
- State requirement under Section 8-37t of the Connecticut General Statutes, to follow 24 CFR Part 91

Consolidated Plan Regulatory Framework 24 CFR Part 91

HUD identified the need for a more systematic and consistent planning process across the spectrum of grantees.

As a result, they created the eCON Planning Suite within IDIS (Integrated Disbursement and Information System)

- This eCon Planning Suite resulted in:
 - A template process that facilitates integrated planning and decision-making
 - Electronic Submission/Review for HUD (IDIS)
 - Standardized reporting (CAPER/PER)

Citizen Participation Plan/Amended CP Plan

Consistent with federal requirements, the State has a published Citizen Participation Plan, which identifies the minimum requirements associated with public input both prior to the creation of the Consolidated Plan, as well as after the creation of the Plan, before submission to HUD for review and approval.

During COVID, HUD published a number of waivers, one of which allowed for relaxed citizen participation, provided an Amendment, consistent with those relaxed provisions were adopted.

- ✓ Usefulness for affordable housing/community development planning
- ✓ Available nationally for all Con Plan grantees
- ✓ Available at the census tract level
- ✓ Regularly updated
- ✓ Little or no cost

- Map query tool to highlight areas with specific, common characteristics
