Opening Remarks and Introductions

Co-Chair Heather Gates convened the meeting at 3:06 PM. Heather then welcomed Paul Acker and Dr. Frank Fortunati, Jr. of Yale New Haven Hospital as her new two Co-Chairs. Introductions of the rest of the committee members were then made.

Behavioral Health Home Update- Alyse Chin (DMHAS), Bonni Hopkins

(Beacon) and Amy Miller (Advanced Behavioral Health) It is important to note some nuances in the HEDIS measures which impact our numerators, denominators, and rates:

- Most of the measures require continuous enrollment in both BHH and Medicaid to be included in the denominator,
- Duals (eligible for Medicaid and Medicare) are not included,

- Clients are assigned to providers based on where they are enrolled and not where they received the service(s) being measured,
- Only claims data is used so DMHAS funded services are not captured, and
- A couple of measures were modified due to the lack of access to medical records or other data sets needed to program these according to CMS specifications.

There are other CT specific outcomes measured included in the presentation as well, and the sources for the data is included on each slide.



Alyse Chin (DMHAS) explained that along with DMHAS, Medicaid and DCF are partners with the fourteen BHH providers. She then introduced Bonni Hopkins (Beacon) and Amy Miller (Advanced Behavioral Health) to give the presentation on the Behavioral Health Home (BHH) program which is a care coordination model. The discussion included questions between the differences of medical homes and BHHs. As a follow-up to the discussion, the following has been sent to the committee by Amy:

- BHH Service Provision (average # of services and if it went up or down) average of three BHH services a month in both 2016 and 2017
