DCF's Goals/Mission

Serve children in care in the least restrictive & most appropriate familybased setting while planning permanency from day one.

The Process

- DCF has engaged in an exhaustive review of children 12 years old and younger who were residing in Congregate Care facilities as of January, 2012
- Each case review focused on potential discharge to community-based setting
- Facilitated case review using the Ann Arundel County Child and Family Readiness Tool (see handout)

Readiness Results

 Readiness is assessed by determining the child's readiness for community-based placement and the family's readiness to receive the child (See handout)
