Update of Transition of members to CHN	Meetings held with Quality and Coordination re. LIA population to ID members, authorizations. ID provider types. 80% match of providers already credentialed with DSS. Outreach being done to focus on specialists. Review of transplant list, national hospitals not a problem. Need to provide current members on list with authorization or transition pt. to in-network provider. Need to identify high risk OB members and those receiving 17P; asses using contracted pharmacy or transition to in-network provider. The State has sent a notice to HUSKY A and B members, noting questions can be addressed by ACS (HUSKY Enrollment Broker). On-line directory available for in-network providers.	Mary Ann Cyr, CHN	Identify capacity of in-network providers to assume care from providers not willing to contract with DSS. Five member forums scheduled throughout the State re. transition.
Transportation	Current arrangement involves FFS with two brokers, Logisticare and First Transit; claims are paid by DSS. Two RFPs have been issued, one broker will manage all non emergency transits. Work was suspended on new RFP in September, awaiting Federal CMS input, and state Attorney General's opinion. No plan to issue new RFP. Present venders agreeable to continue offering transportation until all issues/questions resolved.
