# Women, Opioids and Substance Abuse

> Deaths from drug overdoses have increased dramatically, are currently the number one cause of injury death in the U.S.

>An increasing percentage are as a result of misuse and hazardous use of prescription opioids and heroin

> Approximately 64,000 overdose deaths in US in 2016, 42,249 from opioids, with higher proportion from synthetic opioids

>While overall rates have increased significantly, the increase among women has been the most dramatic

Prescription opioid overdose increased 400% for women and 265% for men (in the decade between 1999 and 2010)
 Rates of heroin use have doubled ( Decade 2002/2004-2011-2014)

> This is a national issue, but each region/state faces unique and particular challenges.

# Why Does Gender/Sex Matter?

- NIH Guidelines for Defining Sex/Gender
- Women Chronic Pain/Prescription Drug Use Higher Than Men
- Different Use Patterns Than Men
- Different Roles and Barriers to TX
  - Family Caregivers (childcare, housing, transportation)
- Different Risk Factors
  - Psychological & Emotional Distress
  - Anxiety and Depression
  - IPV, Sexual Assault, Trauma

### What We Know

- Significant Relationships Play Role in Initiation
- Telescoping
- Women Accelerate to Injecting Drugs at a Faster Rate Than Men
- Caregiver Role Can Temporarily Alter Use Patterns

  - More Prevention and Treatment than past anti-drug initiatives
  - CAPTA-Child Abuse Prevention and Treatment Act amended in 5<sup>th</sup> Title of CARA
    - Plan of Safe Care-Amends current provisions
      - States Receiving National \$ must
        - Address SUD TX needs of infant and family/caregiver
        - Specify Monitoring System for Compliance
    - National Clearinghouse and Best Practices on SCP development
      - Including Information on Addressing FASD Withdrawal Symptoms

## CARA/CAPTA Continued

- Amends National Child Abuse and Neglect Data System (NCANDS) reporting
- New GAO Report on Prevalence of NAS

5<sup>th</sup> Title –Also Addresses Treatment for Pregnant and Post-Partum Women Amends PHS law and Residential TX Programs for Pregnant and Postpartum Women-Strengthening Grant Program Provisions

> Provides for Therapeutic Comprehensive Childcare for Children w/Parent in TX, Supporting Reunification Where Appropriate
