FEDERAL LAW AND POLICY

ACA substantially bolstered and strengthened breastfeeding policies and support

- Mandated coverage for support and counseling services, equipment
- Workplace: required dedicated space for breastfeeding and time for hourly-wage working mothers
- Falls short on Donor Human Milk
- No FDA oversight
