Providers for PCMH Recruitment

- 1,223 Providers available for PCMH recruitment
 - 979 Providers available at non recruited Practices
 - 560 Open to PCMH recruitment
 - 464 providers Regional Network Managers have made contact, educate, and work with them for recruitment into the PCMH program
 - 42 providers currently projected to enroll in 2019 (slide 14)
 - □ 96 newly enrolled CMAP providers to be contacted
 - 419 Not open to PCMH recruitment: providers that were previously engaged and have no interest or are not eligible
 - □ 25% Providers without an EHR
 - □ 20% Providers previously in the PCMH program that have termed
 - 15% Provider was a practice no longer exists (closed, provider retired, acquired by another practice entity
 - 40% Other reasons not interested in PCMH. Reasons include small Medicaid panel, does not want to do the work, no longer a PCP, solo practitioner and lacks resources, provider no longer enrolled in CMAP, staff constraints or frequent turnover
 - 244 Providers at recruited PCMH Practices but not enrolled in PCMH. Reasons not enrolled include:
 - Not practicing at a PCMH site
 - Does not qualify for eligibility (ie does not spend 60% of clinical time as a PCP).
