



Context for ARPA HCBS (Home & Community-Based Services)

	 On March 11, 2021, President Biden signed the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARPA) (Pub. L. 117-2)
Statute	 Section 9817 of ARPA provides qualifying states with a temporary 10 percentage point increase to the federal medical assistance percentage (FMAP) for certain Medicaid expenditures for HCBS beginning April 1, 2021, and ending March 31, 2022
	 Funds must expand, improve or strengthen HCBS
	 CMS recently approved a one-year extension to ARPA. Money must now be invested by March 31, 2025
	 Connecticut's spending plan was submitted to the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) July 2021 & approved December 2021
Overview of CT's Plan	 The Department of Social Services has two operational partners in the implementation of ARPA: Department of Developmental Services and the Department of Mental Health and Addiction Services
	 Connecticut's ARPA HCBS federal reinvestment amount is approximately \$207.7M. Total investment in HCBS is estimated at \$447.1M, including the required state contribution

- ✓DSS paid provider rate increases -\$19.7M

- ✓ DDS paid provider payments
 - ✓ Workforce \$13M
 - ✓ Infrastructure \$9M
 - \checkmark Stabilization \$10.7M

Timeframe	Step
July 2022	Establish ongoing metrics for value- based payments – submit waiver amendments
	Release RFP for smart home development
	Finalize/submit new 24-hour community back up model
August 2022	Launch new services including new Supports at Home Option
February 2023	Launch expanded Universal Assessment
