Potential Expansion of the Connecticut Prescription Monitoring and Reporting System (CPMRS or PDMP)

What is the PDMP?

- The Prescription Monitoring Program collects prescription data for Schedule II through Schedule V drugs into a centralized database.
- That information can be used by healthcare providers and pharmacists in the active treatment of their patients.



What is the purpose of the PDMP?

- The purpose of the PDMP is to present a complete picture of a patient's *controlled substance* use, including prescriptions by other providers.
- As a healthcare tool, the PDMP is used to improve quality of patient care and to reduce prescription abuse, addiction, and overdose.
- This allows providers the opportunity to properly manage the patient's treatment, including the referral of a patient to services offering treatment for drug abuse or addiction when appropriate.



Resourced Used on the PDMP

Database Cost Per Year: \$160,000

- Simployees
 - 0.5 Supervisor (shared with MMP)
 - 2 Full-Time Staff Members
 - 3 Full-Time Durational Staff Members*
 *(grant funded)

What is in the PDMP?

Total Number of Prescription filled in Connecticut in 2016 - 46,324,992¹

Controlled Substances Prescriptions account for 14.1% of all prescriptions in Connecticut.

Staffing Needs for Expansion

- 1 Full-Time Supervisor Position (designated specifically for the PDMP)
- Minimum of 4 new Staff Positions



Financial Requirements (Appriss)

Estimate from our Vendor:



- One-time fee: \$250,000
- Ongoing Maintenance: \$495,000/year



System Expansion Requirements

- Enhancement to evaluate every script and mark as controlled substance or non-controlled substance
- Modify all AWARxE reports for CS and/or non-CS scripts
- Modify PMP Interconnect adaptor to prevent non-CS scripts from being shared
- Modify PMP Interconnect adapter to all allow non-CS scripts to be shared with PMP Gateway
- Modifications to business intelligence tools for CS and/or non-CS scripts



Potential Challenges

The system expansion requirements can help prevent some of the potential challenges we may have that come with making a large database even larger:

- Complicated Picture of Prescription History
 - May make it more challenging for prescribers to prescribe appropriatelyMore Potential Duplication of Patients in Database
- Patient Portal Security
- Future Maintenance Costs
- Electronic Medical Record Integration
