To the members of the Connecticut General Assembly:

Since March of 2020, the citizens of Connecticut have followed the prescribed emergency declarations and executive orders emanating from the elected government of Connecticut. The information available at that time evolved in the 23 months since then, as scientifically, it must.

A great deal of new information was provided by Dr. Harvey Risch, MD, Professor of Epidemiology at the Yale School of Public Health, in a very recent virtual town hall, in which he made the following points:

- <u>Outpatient Covid Treatment</u>: early treatment with use of hydroxychloroquine as well as other remedies: ivermectin, budesonide and others. Tragically, natural and effective treatments exist <u>but were not used</u>!
- The Omicron variant, asymptomatic for 75-85% of people, is found to have no more serious issues than those with general influenza.
- PCR tests do not necessarily reveal current infection. Dr Kary Mullis, the PCR test's inventor, declared that PCR "should not be used to diagnose any disease". It was, in fact, designed as a laboratory tool and not a diagnostic tool, and can therefore produce many false-positives, depending on several factors, especially its cycle threshold. The CDC even admits that "it is extremely difficult to detect any live virus in a sample above a threshold of 33 cycles".
- Masks do not work as purported and pushed by officials. Dr. Risch referenced <u>Dr Paul</u> <u>Alexander's list of 150 Studies on masking</u>.
- Concerns over conflicting interests were raised over Annie Lamont's company, SEMA4, streamed health "initiatives", and supposedly was for the care of the Connecticut citizenry. It was discovered that Governor Lamont's wife's company is not about health initiatives, nor care for the health of Connecticut's citizens.
- Nursing home deaths due to inappropriate of valid, constructive public health actions and the leave of the previous Department of Public Health Commissioner who provided details also is in need of investigation.

The CT General Assembly should vote <u>AGAINST continuing any and all Covid-19 and COVID</u> <u>emergency orders</u>. We have been in an unlawful declared state of emergency for nearly two years now. Emergencies should last no more than a few weeks, and should be based on actual, serious, and provable emergencies. COVID never was a real emergency; in fact, the alleged COVID pathogen has never been isolated or identified as a pathogen by any research or testing lab anywhere in the world in the past two years. The overall death rate from all causes, however,

remained essentially the same as in previous recent years, that is, until the COVID jabs were distributed on a large-scale basis. Far more people have been dying, or having their health seriously compromised, or both, since the COVID jabs were rolled out, and now the overall death rate has increased. Yet policies and mandates, including emergency declarations and executive orders, are based on there being a dangerous and infectious virus in every corner of the globe. The danger, therefore, is in the jabs, not any so-called virus.

No item in any of the emergency orders truly concerns our health; all are restrictive of our rights and are therefore unconstitutional. We are able to make our own decisions based on our personal health; neither the governor nor the legislature has authority to violate anyone's rights as the4y have been doing for the past two years and continue to do so. Executive orders are not authorized in either the state Constitution or the national Constitution, so they are not valid or binding on Connecticut citizens. Moreover, legislative grants of lawmaking authority to the governor or anyone else are also not authorized in either Constitution, which grant that power only to the legislative branch.

We the citizens of Connecticut have been harmed long enough by Ned Lamont's unconstitutional and financially-biased executive orders. We demand that you represent us as you are required to do by your Constitutional oaths.

Furthermore, you should launch an investigation into both Governor Lamont's benefits and elected CT Officials' benefits to his emergency orders actions.
