State Loan Repayment Program Brief

The Connecticut State Loan Repayment Program (SLRP) is a federal-state partnership that assists states in addressing the health professional shortages that cause disparities in access to health care. Participants work for Community Health Centers and other eligible primary care sites in the state. Community Health Centers provide comprehensive primary care services in areas designated by the federal government as Medically Underserved Areas (MUA) and Health Professional shortage Areas (HPSA). Repayment of educational loans in exchange for a period of employment is a significant incentive for eligible clinicians to work in Community Health Centers.

Primary Care Sites sponsor the application of health professionals to the SLRP and the Department monitors all aspects of the contract implementation. A three-party agreement is signed between the health professional, the primary care site and the Department of Public Health. Applications to the program must include a health profession degree, current state licensure or certification, education loans verification, evidence of U.S. citizenship and completion of all prior service obligations. Applicants cannot have a judgment lien against their property for a debt to the United States or have defaulted on any federal payment obligations including, but not limited to, Health Education Assistance Loans, Federal income tax liabilities, and FHA loans, even if the creditor now considers them to be in good standing.

SLRP contracts with the health professional are not to be used to offset salary. Salaries for health professionals participating in the SLRP should be based on prevailing rates in the area. Priority for sponsorship will be given to clinicians that after having completed their first two-year agreement wish to sign a second two-year term. Service credit will begin on the date a SLRP contract agreement is signed by the health professional or the date that the SLRP participant begins full-time practice at the approved site, whichever comes first. SLRP participants must agree to accept Medicare, Medicaid, and State Children's Health Insurance Program (SCHIP) assignment rates and to treat patients regardless of their ability to pay (i.e., discounted sliding fee schedule).

Payments shall be made directly by the health professional to the lending institution. Health professionals are responsible for providing the Department with documentation from the lending institution demonstrating that each payment has been received and appropriately credited. Payments to the lender must be made in a timely manner so as not to incur in late penalties, which cannot be paid by the SLRP.

Eligible Clinicians are physicians with the following training: family medicine, internal medicine, pediatrics obstetrics/gynecology and general psychiatry. Among other health professionals eligible for the program are doctors of osteopathic medicine, primary care physician assistants, general practice dentists, registered clinical dental hygienists, primary care certified nurse practitioners, certified nurse-midwives.
