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Rare Cancers

- Represent approximately 20% of rare diseases and growing
 - As genomic profiling and targeted therapies increase, more variations of cancers are noted, and defined as <u>Rare</u>
 - With nearly 30 Million US citizens having a rare disease, approximately 6 million of those are cancers





What is Fibrolamellar

Form of Liver Cancer – Fibrolamellar Hepatacellur Carcinoma (FLC)

Ultra Rare Cancer: 1 in 5 million

Adolescent /Young Adult: 12-30 year old

Survivorship rate : Less than 30 % (5 year)

No known cause: Victims are young with normal /healthy livers
