Re: Gait Belt

Date: March 20, 2000 Revised: October 19, 2008

Description:

A webbed belt with or without handholds used to:

- 1. Assist staff in holding patient when ambulating and transferring.
- 2. Provide a feeling of security for the patient by providing support.
- 3. Prevent staff from pulling on patients' shoulders when standing and transferring.
- 4. Equalize height and weight differences between staff and patients.

Indications:

1. Any patient whose coordination and balance are unpredictable when transferring and ambulating.

Precautions:

- 1. Care should be taken to apply the belt above gastric tubes/PEG tubes on patients with these types of assistive devices.
- 2. Do not leave on patient when not ambulating.

Procedure:

- 1. Place belt around waist of patient and buckle securely.
- 2. Staff member holds on to loop or around belt depending on type.
- 3. Second hand should support the arm of the patient.
- 4. Staff member should stand slightly behind and lateral to the patient.
- 5. When the gait belt is not in use, it is kept in a secure area inaccessible to patients.
- 6. Clean as per Physical Therapy Cleaning Procedures. Gait belts are available that do not require washing and that can be wiped with PDI Sani Cloths between uses.
